
From the Exalted Ruler

Florida Elks Children's Therapy Services provides **physical therapy** and **occupational therapy** to Florida children who do not have easy access to these services. These in-home support services are provided without regard to the parent's ability to pay. Priority is given to children who do not have ready access to therapy as a result of financial considerations.

Therapists are employed by the Florida Elks and are licensed to practice by the state of Florida. With 23 mobile units, our therapists are treating children throughout the state covering most of its 67 counties.

The services received by patients who meet eligibility requirements are absolutely free. We do not receive financial assistance from any level of government. Instead, we receive our funding from the Harry-Anna Charitable Trust as well as our Elks lodges, various Florida Elks ladies organizations, the Elks National Foundation.

Most Memorable patient: Sam was a 5 year old with severe cerebral palsy. He could not walk, sit or feed himself. I worked primarily on obtaining equipment for Sam and then educated the family on the importance of allowing him to attempt

feeding himself. All the Elks Lodges in the SW District contributed funds to buy a hydraulic stander for home use that helped Sam feed himself more successfully as he was now in an appropriate, upright position for safe swallowing, eye and hand use.




