ELKS COMMUNITY SERVICE! From Jim Hoey

Palmetto Elks 2449 has been providing community service to children in a local (soon to be state-wide) Dive Into Reading program. The program is designed to help children in Title One schools from first through third grade raise their reading skills. Sadly, 51% of Manatee County, FL children in the third grade cannot read at the third grade level. These statistics are similar throughout the south Florida Title One school system.

The Anna Maria Oyster Bar piloted this program after they heard the statistics above (from school employees) and realized that from birth to third grade we "Learn to Read" and from third grade onward we "Read to Learn." Children who cannot read at grade level after third grade usually do not make it through high school. And their future is dim with regards to being a productive member of society after that.

In its third year now, the Dive Into Reading program has proven to be successful at raising the reading levels of children who participate in the program. The local school system brings children to the restaurant for breakfast with a Mentor. The mentors assist the children by reading with and to them from grade level books, then having the children read back from the same book. The program runs for one month in June. Children are tested by the school system at the end of the school year and then again at the beginning of the next school year. After attending the Dive Into Reading program the results show positive improvement, or at least no loss of reading skills, throughout the summer months. Statistically, these children would normally lose up to 3 months of reading skills during summer break.

Palmetto Elks involvement started at the Mentor level. Then in year two the Elks Lodge donated over 200 backpacks with school supplies to the attending children. This year, 2019, there will be over 400 children attending. The program is growing, and other local restaurants are now participating. Sarasota County school system has also joined the program. The need for more support is growing along with the program. Palmetto Elks Lodge has committed to providing an adequate number of backpacks for the program. The Lodge is working with other Elk Lodges in the district to expand participation.

Americanism Flag Day – June 14

Flag Day celebrates the adoption of the flag the official symbol for the United States: our Stars and Stripes. This day was first recognized by Congress on June 14, 1777, which became known as Flag Day. Congress first stated that there should be a star and stripe for every state. Our first flag had 13 stars, and 7 red and 6 white stripes. In 1794, two new states were added and we had a flag with 15 stars and 15 stripes.

By 1818 there were 20 states, but our county was still using the flag with 15 stars and 15 stripes. Congress thought about having 20 stripes and agreed that it might become a problem because of its size so they passed a law that said there would be 13 stripes for the original 13 states, and they would add a star for each new state that joined the union. The U.S. flag has 13 stripes: seven red and six white. A blue field with 50 stars is located next to the staff in the upper left corner of the flag. The stars do not represent any given state. The colors used in the flag give special meaning to the flag: Red for valor and zeal; white for hope and cleanliness of life; and blue — the color of heaven — for reverence and loyalty.

Flag day is also a mandatory service in the Elks. Please check your calendar and come to our service. It is informative and very interesting.
