Independence Day

It took thirteen years, from 1754 to 1767, for the colonies to go from loyal subjects, helping the war cause, to rebels, intent on expelling Britain from the new world. There were two main reasons: One was that the colonists were intent on getting rid of King George III so they could practice religion free from the Church of England. The second was that the newly rich wanted to keep their wealth instead of sharing it with England. The French and Indian war left the colonies in debt and England wanted us to pay for keeping their colony intact. A series of taxes left us reeling: The Currency Act, The



Sugar Act, The Quartering Act and the Stamp Act, a tax on everything from paint to playing cards. England employed 12,000 Hessian mercenaries to quell the uprising. Thus began the "City on the Hill' that is, the United States of America. Our Declaration of Independence was formally accepted by the Continental Congress on July 4, 1776 and is celebrated with fireworks and parties. The actual signing was on August 2, 1776, when fifty members of Congress signed and six more (with Thomas McKean, Delaware, in 1781 by special permission, having served in the army in the interim). It was in the Dog Days of August 1776, when with the finality of signature, we severed our ties with England forever!
