

Fun on the Lake—with paddleboats, canoes, relaxing on the shore, and fishing, catching and release fishing is allowed.

Lodge Homes—Just up the hill from the lake all the comforts of home sleeps nine, heating & air conditioning, personal storage facilities, complete restrooms with hot showers. All are accessible to campers with physic limitations.

The Pavilion—15,000 square foot enclosed pavilion with a full modern kitchen facilities serves as a dining hall. Also used for games and nighttime and inclement weather activities.

Gymnasium—Adjacent to the pavilion housing 3 full length basketball courts, accommodates 850 people. Includes conference rooms and houses the offices of the State Association.

Pool—A 25 meter, 7 lane heated swimming pool with wheelchair access, adjoining restroom and shower. A second pool that has been added to accommodate the growth of the camp, is in the completion stages to be ready for this year's festivities.

Athletic Fun—archery, flag football, soccer, softball, volleyball, golf driving range, miniature golf, and rope courses.

A trip is being planned in the fall to put a bus load together of members to take a trip to the camp and see what it's all about. Plan on coming for a great experience. Rose Wujcik, Public Relations Chairman

History of Independence Day

Variously known as the Fourth of July and Independence Day, July 4th has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, but the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution (1775-83). In June 1776, representatives of the 13 colonies then fighting in the revolutionary struggle weighed a resolution that would declare their independence from Great Britain. On July 2nd, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later its delegates adopted the Declaration of Independence, a historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson. From 1776 until the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with typical festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues.






Harry-Anna Trust Fund

Of everything that the Florida Elks do, perhaps nothing is more important than our work with the state's youth. Sowing the seeds of accomplishments and commitment through our Florida Eks Children's Therapy Services and Florida Elks Youth Camp programs, children are given the opportunity to grow and learn beyond their wildest imaginations. The Harry-Anna Trust Fund was established in 1951. The purpose of this charitable trust was, and continues to be, the collection of donations, the selling of trust fund certificates, and the acceptance of endowed gifts.

The trust fund is restricted, which means that only the income derived from it may be used to support our major projects: the Florida Elks Children's Therapy Service and Florida Elks Youth Camp Programs.

The monies will be used for the veterans honors program performed by the VFW at the Hospice. The VFW presents each veteran with a pin during the ceremony thanking them for their service to our country. The wives of the veterans are presented a veterans pin with an angel during the ceremony along with an American flag. If the veteran has a son or daughter serving in the military, they receive a partnership pin in honor of their parent that served. With additional monies from the grant, Palmetto Elks will be supplying the family of the veterans visiting their loved ones at Tidewell, a spaghetti dinner weekly. The Ellenton Florida Tidewell Hospice is the only hospice that currently works in tandem with the VFW to perform this ceremony.


