#### From the desk of the Secretary

Dear Elk Members,

I get phone calls at the lodge daily asking questions such as: My husband passed away why do I still get his mail?

Why did I not receive my widows card? I did not receive my bulletin in the mail? I do not receive my bulletin by email anymore? I did not receive your call?

Well I would like to take this time to formally answer ALL of your questions.

If your spouse passed away, unless you or someone informs the office his record is not marked as deceased. Unfortunately we cannot hold our lodge of sorrows for him which means a great deal to his brother elks to mark his passing.

If you are a widow I do not automatically send out your card, there are a number of reasons. First, an active member has to sign your request. Second, I don't know if you have moved. Third, I don't know if you really want one. Fourth I do not know if the widow has passed away.

One of the reasons you may not be getting your bulletin by mail as well as dues notices is that you may have moved and forgot to give the office you new address. This year alone I had 20 envelopes returned because they could not be forwarded. If you have a northern address please let the office know. This way if we have any important mailing we can send it to your alternate address saving time and postage.

As far as not receiving your bulletin by email, if you changed your email address and did not notify the bulletin editor or office it will be impossible to contact you and your email bounces back. After four months you are dropped from the list. Another reason is your mail box is full, please empty your mail boxes so you can receive the bulletin. If you have changed your email, please send the new email address to: palmettoelks1@gmail.com.

Last but not least phone numbers. I had a list of 140 individual that needed to be called and 70 of these were either the wrong number or disconnected. It is impossible to keep in contact with you unless you provided us with the correct information. If you have dropped you land line and use you cell let the office know. If you have a northern number let us know.

As you can see the reason you have not been receiving the communications is because you have not communicated with the office so that we can keep in touch with you.

#### The Birth of American Independence



During the American Revolution, the legal separation of the Thirteen Colonies from Great Britain occurred on July 2, 1776, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed in June by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia declaring the United States independent from Great Britain. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the Declaration of Independence, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a Committee of Five, with Thomas Jefferson as its principal

author. Congress debated and revised the wording of the Declaration, finally approving it on July 4. A day earlier, John Adams had written to his wife Abigail:

The second day of July, 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more.

Adams's prediction was off by two days. From the outset, Americans celebrated independence on July 4, the date shown on the much-publicized Declaration of Independence, rather than on July 2, the date the resolution of independence was approved in a closed session of Congress.

When a shooting war broke out in Korea in 1950, the Elks responded by sending gift packs as they had in World War II. The same was done during the conflicts in Vietnam, Desert Storm, and continues in our most recent confrontations in the Middle and Far East.

In 1951 during the Korean War, the Secretary of Defense appealed to the Order for help in procuring blood for our wounded. Within a few months, the Elks Lodges obtained over a half million pints.

During the Vietnam War, the Defense Department was concerned with the morale of our 400,000 troops fighting communist aggression because of the anti-American sentiments being reported on the home front. After much discussion, it was decided that a "Letters from Home" campaign would help counteract all the negative acts emanating from this country.

The Elks again answered the call and flooded these fine young defenders of freedom with letters expressing our gratitude for the sacrifices they were making for our country.

When the Commission learned that wounded veterans from Vietnam were sweltering in Tripler Army Medical Center that lacked air conditioning, they provided 24 air conditioning units so that these military personnel might recover in relative comfort.

The Elks were among the first fraternal organizations to formally welcome home the returning veterans from Operation Desert Storm. Local Lodges held appropriate functions recognizing the veteran's sacrifices and thanking them for their commitment to duty. Care packages and letter writing campaigns were renewed for the troops in Desert Storm, and continue to this day supporting our troops in the war against terrorism.

At the National Convention held In New Orleans in 1995, the delegates voted on July 13th to change the name of the Elks National Service Commission to the Elks National Veterans Service Commission, just as it was from 1946 to 1949. Then, at the National Convention in Philadelphia in 2001, the delegates voted to amend our pledge, which now reads "So long as there are veterans, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them". By removing the words "in our hospitals", we have expanded our outreach to all veterans. While our name has changed, our mission is the same-to provide aid and comfort to any veteran in need.

In 1997, the Elks National Veterans Service Commission began to provide financial support for National Cultural and Athletic Competitions hosted by the Department of Veterans Affairs. These events provide a venue for disabled or senior veterans to compete athletically on a national level. We support the National Veterans Winter and Summer Sports Clinics, Wheelchair Games, Golden Age Games, and the National TEE Tournament (for visually impaired Veterans) as well as the Creative Arts Festival for Veterans.

Since 1986, the Commission has worked closely with Re-Creation, USA, a group of young men and women volunteers who travel the country bringing a Broadway style show to our hospitalized veterans. This program helps brighten the days of those confined to VA Medical Centers and Veterans long term care facilities.

Next month we will emphasize the more recent changes and additions since 2002, which includes the Army Of Hope.



#### Palmetto Elks #2449 House Rules

- All outside entrances to the club facilities will be secured at all times. Entrances during operating hours may be gained by the use of current key card or admission by a member or employee after proper identification
- Only regular members in good standing of BPOE #2449 will be issued current key cards by the Lodge Secretary. The use of a key card is limited to whom it is issued.
- All visiting Elks in good standing will be admitted to the club facilities by displaying a current membership card from their home Lodge after signing our guest register.
- 4. All individuals entitled to a BPOE #2449 identification card will by admitted to the club facilities by displaying their current identification card.
  - a. The Lodge Secretary will issue identification cards to spouses of current members in good standing of Palmetto Elks #2449
  - b. The Lodge Secretary will issue identification cards to unmarried widows of deceased members of Palmetto Lodge #2449 In good standing. A request for this card shall be in writing to the Lodge Secretary and this application must be approved by the Elected Officer of Palmetto Lodge #2449
  - All holders of Lodge identification cards must be 21 years of age.
- 5. A valid membership of identification card is issued by any subordinate Lodge of the BPOE America must be shown in order to obtain service at the bar, or dining room and only authorized holders may purchase beverages in the club. Under no circumstances will unauthorized individuals be allowed to purchase alcoholic beverages.
- 6. The club hours will be established by the Corporation.
- 7. Conduct and dress in the Lodge building are expected to reflect the high ideals of Elkdom keeping in mind Elks are nice people doing great things together. Certainly loud, boisterous vulgar or obscene language is prohibited and shall not be tolerated.
- 8. No beverages whether alcoholic or non-alcoholic, regardless of the type of container will be brought into or carried from the premises except those purchased for the Lodge use.
- Persons appearing to be inebriated or those who have imbibed to excess will not be served further alcoholic beverages.
- 10. All automobile, trucks or other motor vehicles that are parked in the paved parking lot will be within the designated lines.
- No animals or pets of any kind will be allowed in the building with the exception of Service Dogs.
- Check will be cashed for members of BPOE #2449 and any other Elk in good standing by the management.

The Club Manager shall insure that these rules are strictly enforced and shall report any violation to the Board of Directors.
