### Bradenton #1511 - "Elks Feeding Empty Little Tummies" (E.F.E.L.T.). Should Palmetto Elks Help?



This project provides meals over the weekend for homeless children through a backpack program. The food we provide is for these children to enjoy is for Saturday and Sunday as typically they would not have anything to eat

over the weekend. They are all "Title 1" children hence meals are provided while they attend school. However, over the weekend they go without food which waking up hungry, going to school hungry makes it hard to focus. They are missing essential nutrition which can stunt their physical development. Hunger affects more than just grades, as behavioral problems such as anxiety, and anger are associated with hunger. This is a travesty, as no child, regardless of their situation should go without food.

In conjunction with the Manatee County School Board we have identified 300 of the over 1,600 homeless kids between the ages of 6 and 12 years of age. We buy food, inventory, stock, and pack the meals in backpacks and deliver to the elementary school where they attend. Some of these kids reside in the back of cars, in group homes, and motels, all are homeless as defined by the School Board. All monies obtained through grants, philanthropy, benefits, and donations go to purchasing food, there is no administrative expense. All manpower, mileage, gasoline, paper, etc.. costs are voluntary and in-kind. Continued page 4

Our goal is, not only feed as many kids as we can afford through grants, and donations of money, and/or food, but also to bring awareness to Manatee County about the number and problems associated with homeless children in our community. Thank you for your help in providing food, and awareness for these unfortunate children.

Our Mission is to provide weekend food for homeless elementary age children through a back-pack program, and raise awareness in our community of the needs of these homeless children.

In Manatee County Florida there are 42,000 students K-12, of which 51% are considered Title 1, or on free or reduced out-of-pocket cost for the breakfast and lunch at the school. The elementary population of 21,143, has 75% Title 1 or 15,107 elementary children are on free or reduced lunch. Of those 15,107 students, 3362 are attending specifically designated Title 1 schools. Within that population, the school system estimates that 1,600 are <a href="https://example.com/homeless">homeless</a>, living in the back or a car, under a bridge, local wooded camping areas, or in homeless shelters. Children are coming to school hungry, taking aspirin instead of eating lunch to rid themselves of headache associated with hunger. Although the school system is doing its best to feed these children breakfast and lunch during the week, over the weekend there is a significant population of children that go hungry, and many are homeless. Our project is designed to provide six meals to the homeless children over the weekend.

The School Board identifies these children, and the Elks provide the food to feed the children through a discreet process where we are unknowledgeable of the child's name or whereabouts. Food and snacks will be processed by the Elk volunteers, placed in back-packs and delivered to the school on Friday for distribution.

Food items will be non-perishable, recommended by the School Board Nutritionist, and purchased from "The Food Bank" operated by Meals on Wheels of Manatee County. Food stuffs will be stored and packed in a 2500 sq. ft. facility with shelving donated by Judy Witt of Wagner Reality. Our responsibility for that facility is utilities only.

The project began with 60 children and in September 2011 expands to a 300 child population which pales in comparison to the homeless child population, however the project is planned to become self-sufficient by the forth year, subsidized by local agencies, church groups, foundations such as The Elks National Foundation, The Service Club of Manatee County, Albertsons, Wal-Mart, Publics, The Community Foundation, and local donations, Our project will expand as funds are obtained. To date, community expressed support, given the success of this grant, has been overwhelming.

Due to a tremendous outpouring of donated food, our cost of operation over the period of January 6 to June 6th has averaged \$1.51 per backpack with an average meal cost of \$0.25 and an item cost of \$0.12 each. Backpacks can be obtained on-line at a cost of \$4-\$7.00 depending on the quality and if purchased in quantities of 200+. Food can be purchased at the Food Bank of Manatee County for \$0.18 per pound. However many items need to small and "child friendly" hence Sam's Club or food drives will need to augment the Food Bank purchases, assuming you have a 501(c)3 tax status.

Attached is the list of foods you will need which can not be purchased at the food bank. Our example menu consists of:

- 2 protein dinners,
- 2 protein lunches
- 2 Breakfast (instant oatmeal / cereal)

fruit cup

apple sauce cup

raisons

pudding snack

juice or other box drink

powered milk if cereal or Mac n Cheese.

cheese or peanut butter cracker snacks

treats like cookies, chips

loaf of bread (free at food bank) especially if peanut butter.

#### "OLD GLORY!"

This famous name was coined by Captain William Driver, a shipmaster of Salem, Massachusetts, in 1831. As he was leaving on one of his many voyages aboard the brig CHARLES DOGGETT - and this one would climax with the rescue of the mutineers of the BOUNTY - some friends presented him with a beautiful flag of twenty four stars. As the banner opened to the ocean breeze for the first time, he exclaimed "Old Glory!"

He retired to Nashville in 1837, taking his treasured flag from his sea days with him. By the time the Civil War erupted, most everyone in and around Nashville recognized Captain Driver's "Old Glory." When Tennessee seceded from the Union, Rebels were determined to destroy his flag, but repeated searches revealed no trace of the hated banner.

Then on February 25th, 1862, Union forces captured Nashville and raised the American flag over the capital. It was a rather small ensign and immediately folks began asking Captain Driver if "Old Glory" still existed. Happy to have soldiers with him this time, Captain Driver went home and began ripping at the seams of his bedcover. As the stitches holding the quilt-top to the batting unraveled, the onlookers peered inside and saw the 24-starred original "Old Glory"! Captain Driver gently gathered up the flag and returned with the soldiers to the capitol. Though he was sixty years old, the Captain climbed up to the tower to replace the smaller banner with his beloved flag. The Sixth Ohio Regiment cheered and saluted - and later adopted the nickname "Old Glory" as their own, telling and re-telling the story of Captain Driver's devotion to the flag we honor yet today. Captain Driver's grave is located in the old Nashville City Cemetery, and is one of three (3) places authorized by act of Congress where the Flag of the United States may be flown 24 hours a day.
