From the Exalted Ruler



Hello Brother and Sister Elks,

I just returned from the Elks National Convention held this year in Reno, Nevada. There were many sessions to attend, about 6500 Elks in attendance, with approximately 300 from Florida. There were folks in attendance from Alaska, Hawaii, Philippines and the Panama Canal Zone. Highlights included the election and installation of Grand Exalted Ruler Millard Pickering, seeing and hearing the finalists for National Hoop Shoot competition, the top male and female ENF scholarship recipients and participation in the Grand Lodge legislative session. Florida was recognized for its state of the art Youth Camp, which arguably is the best Camp in the country. I spoke with Elks from all over the country, found that many lodges face the same challenges as we do with finances and declining

membership.

Our Volunteer for the month of August is Judy Vergason. Judy has been the lodge Secretary for the past 8 years, is regarded as one of the best in the state and our lodge is blessed to have Judy in this capacity. She is being recognized for her vision, passion and caring for underprivileged children and our nation's veterans. Recently, the Palmetto Elks hosted a back to school party for 100 of the area's grade school children. She sent letters out to over 40 of the area's merchants, made her pleas for donations, and acquired enough school supplies to send each child home with a grocery bag full. The list was exhaustive, but included the regular pencils and paper to glue, folders and even hand sanitizer. The children were given hot dogs, many had their parents with them. Tears were flowing. We were told that many children don't even have beds to sleep on, and some don't even have working lights in their homes. Judy also writes the applications for grants from the Grand Lodge and state association. She does this so well that she has qualified Palmetto Elks lodge for every grant applied for, which will increase our reach next year. Watch the local newspapers for the results of Judy's efforts. Our lodge is receiving a great deal of good publicity. When you see Judy in the lodge, please thank her for her service to our lodge. Judy, you are truly a remarkable Elk.

To qualify for some of the grant money mentioned above, the lodges have to meet the per capita goal set by Grand Lodge. This year it is approximately \$4.60 for ENF. What this means is that you multiply \$4.60 times membership of 496 and you get the goal number. It's touch and go every year to meet this goal, however when we do, we will qualify for at least \$4,000 in grant money coming back to our lodge to be used for community needs. If only 200 members would donate \$10 to ENF, we could easily meet this goal. For this reason, in next month's bulletin we will feature the Palmetto Elks Lodge ENF Honor Roll. This will be similar to the bulletin boosters you see listed. To qualify for the Honor Roll, you will need to donate \$20 or more to ENF through the lodge. You can get the forms for donation from Wes Townsend, Judy Vergason, Judy Alf and other lodge officers, or call the lodge during daytime hours. The form is also published in the bulletin. All you have to do is cut it out and mail it or bring it in with your next visit. The sooner we meet the per capita, the sooner Judy can apply for grant money. Each of the grant applications have different deadlines.

On August 10th we will be hosting the DDGER—DVP Dinner at the lodge. This is a great time to meet our district officers and enjoy a good meal. The cost is only \$5 for a great baked potato bar and caesar salad. Tickets need to be purchased in advance and can be picked up at the lodge. We are looking for donations for hors d'oeuvres to feed ten people. If you can help the sign up sheet is posted in the lounge.

Finally, I hope you all are reading the Palmetto Elks Reminder each week. This is an emailed list of happenings in our lodge, coming out about a week in advance. If you read recent Reminders, you knew that the "Ladies of Legend" are performing on Spaghetti night during the summer months. You also could find out about additional nights to practice your Karaoke performances. If you don't currently get these reminders, contact the lodge with your email address.

The school was sent 1 ream of copy paper for each child there were 100 children.

Before I tell you where the donations came from and how much we made and how much we spent. I want to give you some food for thought. If a parent had to buy each of these items NOT on sale it would total approx. \$72.00. Multiply that by 100 and I would have needed \$7,200.00

The amount spent was \$2,705.43.

The amount taken in was \$2,534.00

In this amount is included \$2,234 in cash, of which Emmanuel Baptist Sunday School Class gave \$106.00 plus school supplies. Keaton's gave pens, pencils, glue sticks, rulers, highlighters, Publix gave paper bags to hold the supplies plus a \$100 gift card. Staples gave \$50 gift card, Sweet Bay gave \$25 gift card, Applebee's gave \$25 gift card, YachtSea Grille gave \$50 gift card, Wal-Mart \$50.00 gift card and Red Lobster also donated paper bags.

Unfortunately there were stores in our community that did not have time for our children they were K-mart, Walgreens, CVS and Office Depot.

You have really made my heart fill with joy, and I want to leave you with this final thought that David Vergason, my late husband told me no man reaches so high as one who bends down to help a child. Thank you for bending down and helping. I am looking forward to doing this again next year with you.
