RESOLUTIONS were announced. 14 were adopted. Final report for Ritual and Tallahassee Florida finished second. Thursday's reports on Hoop Shoot and Scholarship winners were presented. These winners were present and given their awards. \$500,000 in scholarship money went to the top 20 in the country. Installation of Grand Lodge Officers and D.D.G.E.R.'s took place. Our own Dave Manning was sworn in . Final attendance was 9240. In closing , thanks to all our members for their contributions to Elk Charities. These contributions come back to us in the form of grants , which are used to help those in need in our community.

In February of 2003, then Grand Exalted Ruler Roger True proposed a new national program, to be called the 'Army of Hope', with special emphasis given to the families of those members of the Military Reserve and National Guard units that had been deployed overseas. The absence of a key family member from the home can cause not only financial distress, it may mean that the service person deployed was not available for maintenance of the home, family

vehicle, or any number of family oriented tasks. Lodges participating in the Army of Hope provide temporary financial relief, routine maintenance for homes and vehicles, caregiving, food, necessities, and even Christmas gifts for the children of families in need while their loved ones defend our country.

In 2011, the Elks National Veterans Service Commission began offering 'Freedom Grants' of \$2,000 each to Lodges which submitted proposals designed to help veterans in their communities. Freedom Grants have been used to provide comfort and care to Veterans in hospitals, long term care facilities, and at home. They have helped homeless veterans re-establish themselves by providing housing, clothing and necessities. Freedom Grants have purchased therapeutic and recreational equipment for veterans' hospitals and for veterans at home. Many Freedom Grants are used to aid the families of those on active service as well as the service men and women themselves.

We are proud to say that the Elks National Veterans Service Commission, our Local Lodge Veterans Committees, and our State Associations. Our story is long; our work is humble; our history is proud. The Elks National Veterans Service Commission will continue, "Serving Our Nation's Veterans".

If you have an opportunity, please go to the Florida State Elks Association web page and read the cover story which can be found here http://floridaelks.org/defenders-of-freedom-flight. You will find 10 honored veterans from the state of Florida including Palmetto's own Frank Campbell. When you see Frank in your lodge, be sure to ask him about the ceremony. He would be proud to tell you about it.

Coming up you will again find the collection barrel in the lodge. This is where we ask you to bring in underwear, socks, tee shirts, toilet articles to be taken to Bay Pines for veterans undergoing treatment.

Whenever and wherever you meet a veteran, always thank them for their service.



Palmetto Elks #2449 House Rules

- All outside entrances to the club facilities will be secured at all times. Entrances during operating hours may be gained by the use of current key card or admission by a member or employee after proper identification
- Only regular members in good standing of BPOE #2449 will be issued current key cards by the Lodge Secretary. The use of a key card is limited to whom it is issued.
- All visiting Elks in good standing will be admitted to the club facilities by displaying a current membership card from their home Lodge after signing our guest register.
- All individuals entitled to a BPOE #2449 identification card will by admitted to the club facilities by displaying their current identification card.
 - a. The Lodge Secretary will issue identification cards to spouses of current members in good standing of Palmetto Elks #2449
 - b. The Lodge Secretary will issue identification cards to unmarried widows of deceased members of Palmetto Lodge #2449 In good standing. A request for this card shall be in writing to the Lodge Secretary and this application must be approved by the Elected Officer of Palmetto Lodge #2449
 - All holders of Lodge identification cards must be 21 years of age.
- 5. A valid membership of identification card is issued by any subordinate Lodge of the BPOE America must be shown in order to obtain service at the bar, or dining room and only authorized holders may purchase beverages in the club. Under no circumstances will unauthorized individuals be allowed to purchase alcoholic beverages.
- 6. The club hours will be established by the Corporation.
- 7. Conduct and dress in the Lodge building are expected to reflect the high ideals of Elkdom keeping in mind Elks are nice people doing great things together. Certainly loud, boisterous vulgar or obscene language is prohibited and shall not be tolerated.
- 8. No beverages whether alcoholic or non-alcoholic, regardless of the type of container will be brought into or carried from the premises except those purchased for the Lodge use.
- Persons appearing to be inebriated or those who have imbibed to excess will not be served further alcoholic beverages.
- 10. All automobile, trucks or other motor vehicles that are parked in the paved parking lot will be within the designated lines.
- 11. No animals or pets of any kind will be allowed in the building with the exception of Service Dogs.
- Check will be cashed for members of BPOE #2449 and any other Elk in good standing by the management.

The Club Manager shall insure that these rules are strictly enforced and shall report any violation to the Board of Directors.






was, and continues to be, the collection of donations, the selling of trust fund certificates, and the acceptance of endowed gifts.




