

Last month the information about the various grants that are available for lodges to apply for was shared. This month here is some information on Now our lodge has been able to use monies from these grants awarded to us.

On June 13th we were able to present Tidewell Hospice, a check for \$1600 from the Gratitude Grant. The monies will be used for the veterans honors program performed by the VFW at the Hospice. The Ellenton Tidewell Hospice is the only one that provides this service to our veterans. An additional \$200 from this grant is to be used for our lodge to provide the families of these vets with a spaghetti

dinner during their stay at the hospice. Once our ENF goal for this year is achieved we will be able to apply for this grant again enabling our lodge to continue with support to the veterans in our community.

July 20th the lodge hosted 100 children for a back to school party with monies that we were given from the Beacon Grant. Each child was presented with a bag of supplies to help them get started for the new school year. Our lodge has already been granted the Beacon and Promise Grants at \$2000 each. Shopping is already underway for the 2014-2015 school year. With these grants we will be able to help 200 children with

Patriot Day

Patriot Day is an annual observance on September 11 to remember those who were injured or who died during the terrorist attacks in the U.S. on September 11, 2001. On the direction of the President, the flag of the United States of America should be displayed on the homes of Americans, the White House and all United States government buildings in the whole world. The flag should be flown at half-mast as a mark of respect to those who died. Many people observe a moment of

silence at 8:46 am, which marks the time that the first plane flew into the World Trade Center. On September 11, 2001, four planes were hijacked and three of the planes were flown deliberately into two important buildings, the Pentagon in Washington DC and the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in New York. The fourth crashed into a field near Shanksville, Penn. The loss of life and damage that these hijackings caused from the biggest act of terrorism ever on the U.S. soil. Nearly 3,000 people died in the attacks and the economic impact was immense.
