Working together for membership hopefully this year we will have a positive number. It takes ALL of us to do the job.

You will notice a suggestion box next to the bulletin board leading to the men's restroom. If you have a suggestion, a constructive criticism, an idea or a thank you let us hear from you.



Some interesting September history and facts to remember.

Sep 2, 1944 - Navy pilot George Herbert Walker Bush was shot down by Japanese forces as he completed a bombing run over the Bonin Islands.

Sep 2, 1945 - Aboard the USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay, Japan formally surrenders to the Allies, bringing an end to World War II.

Sep 3, 1944 - First combat employment of a missile guided by radio and television takes place when Navy drone Liberator, controlled by Ensign James M. Simpson in a PV, flew to attack German submarine pens on Helgoland Island.

Sep 4, 1793 – George Washington was inaugurated as President for the second time.

Sep 5, 1944 – The U.S. Eighth Air Force launches the first American bombing raid against the German capital.

Sep 5, 1969 - Lt. William Calley is charged with six specifications of premeditated murder in the death of 109 Vietnamese civilians at My Lai in March 1968.

Sep 7, 1940 - Nazi Germany began its initial blitz on London during the World War II Battle of Britain.

Sep 9, 1942 - A Japanese floatplane drops incendiary bombs on an Oregon state forest-the first and only attack on the U.S. mainland in the war.

Sep 9, 1951 - Fourth Fighter-Interceptor Wing Captains Richard S. Becker and Ralph D. Gibson became the second and third aces of the Korean War, with five kills each.

Sep 11, 1990 - President Bush addressed Congress on the Persian Gulf crisis, vowing that "Saddam Hussein will fail" in his takeover of Kuwait.

Sep 11, 2001 - At 8:45 a.m. on a clear Tuesday morning, an American Airlines Boeing 767 loaded with 20,000 gallons of jet fuel crashes into the north tower of the World Trade Center in New York City.

Sep 13, 1990 - The 1st Battalion, 2d Marine Regiment embarked and arrived in Saudi Arabia in support of Desert Shield.

Sep 15, 1935 – In Berlin, the Reich under Adolf Hitler adopted The Nuremberg Laws which deprived German Jews of their citizenship, made the swastika the official symbol of Nazi Germany and established gradations of "Jewishness."

Sep 16, 1620 – The Mayflower sails from Plymouth, England, bound for the New World with 102 passengers. The ship was headed for Virginia, where the colonists-half religious dissenters and half entrepreneurs-had been authorized to settle by the British crown.

Sep 17, 1919 – General John J. Pershing, commander of the American Expeditionary Force in Europe during World War I, leads the National Victory Day Parade down Pennsylvania Avenue and past the White House.

Sep 17, 1950 – The 5th Marine Regiment seized Kimpo Airfield, allowing F4U Corsairs from the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing to land and begin combat operations.

Sep 18, 1945 – Gen. Douglas MacArthur moves his command headquarters to Tokyo, as he prepares for his new role as architect of a democratic and capitalist postwar Japan.

Sep 20 - NATIONAL POW/MIA RECOGNITION DAY

Sep 20, 1990 - PSU 301 became the second reserve Coast Guard port security unit deployed in support of Operation Desert Shield.

Sep 21, 1942 - The U.S. B-29 Superfortress makes its debut flight in Seattle, Washington.

Sep 23, 1949 - In a surprisingly low-key and carefully worded statement, President Harry S. Truman informs the American people that the Soviets have exploded a nuclear bomb.

Sep 23, 1991 - UN weapons inspectors in Baghdad discovered documents detailing Iraq's secret nuclear weapons program and said Iraq was close to building a bomb.

Sep 26, 1918 - The Imperial German Navy's submarine UB-91 torpedoed and sank the CGC Tampa (formerly named Miami) which was escorting a convoy bound for Milford Haven, Wales, with all hands.

Sep 27, 1940 - The Axis powers are formed as Germany, Italy, and Japan become allies with the signing of the Tripartite Pact in Berlin.

Sep 29, 1899 - VFW established.

Sep 30, 1946 - An international military tribunal in Nuremberg, Germany, found 22 top Nazi leaders guilty of war crimes.

Sep 30, 1954 - The USS Nautilus, the world's first nuclear submarine, is commissioned by the U.S. Navy.

Palmetto Elks #2449 House Rules

- All outside entrances to the club facilities will be secured at all times. Entrances during operating hours may be gained by the use of current key card or admission by a member or employee after proper identification
- Only regular members in good standing of BPOE #2449 will be issued current key cards by the Lodge Secretary. The use of a key card is limited to whom it is issued.
- All visiting Elks in good standing will be admitted to the club facilities by displaying a current membership card from their home Lodge after signing our guest register.
- All individuals entitled to a BPOE #2449 identification card will by admitted to the club facilities by displaying their current identification card.
 - a. The Lodge Secretary will issue identification cards to spouses of current members in good standing of Palmetto Elks #2449
 - b. The Lodge Secretary will issue identification cards to unmarried widows of deceased members of Palmetto Lodge #2449 In good standing. A request for this card shall be in writing to the Lodge Secretary and this application must be approved by the Elected Officer of Palmetto Lodge #2449
 - All holders of Lodge identification cards must be 21 years of age.
- 5. A valid membership of identification card is issued by any subordinate Lodge of the BPOE America must be shown in order to obtain service at the bar, or dining room and only authorized holders may purchase beverages in the club. Under no circumstances will unauthorized individuals be allowed to purchase alcoholic beverages.
- 6. The club hours will be established by the Corporation.
- 7. Conduct and dress in the Lodge building are expected to reflect the high ideals of Elkdom keeping in mind Elks are nice people doing great things together. Certainly loud, boisterous vulgar or obscene language is prohibited and shall not be tolerated.
- 8. No beverages whether alcoholic or non-alcoholic, regardless of the type of container will be brought into or carried from the premises except those purchased for the Lodge use.
- Persons appearing to be inebriated or those who have imbibed to excess will not be served further alcoholic beverages.
- 10. All automobile, trucks or other motor vehicles that are parked in the paved parking lot will be within the designated lines.
- 11. No animals or pets of any kind will be allowed in the building with the exception of Service Dogs.
- Check will be cashed for members of BPOE #2449 and any other Elk in good standing by the management.

The Club Manager shall insure that these rules are strictly enforced and shall report any violation to the Board of Directors.








and the acceptance of endowed gifts.




