On September 11, 2001, four planes were hijacked and three of the planes were flown deliberately into two important buildings, the Pentagon in Washington DC and the Twin Towers of the World Trade

Center in New York. The fourth crashed into a field near Shanksville, Penn. The loss of life and damage that these hijackings caused form the biggest act of terrorism ever on the U.S. soil. Nearly 3,000 people died in the attacks and the economic impact was immense.




