ENF Scholarship Program



The Elks National Foundation, ENF, offers three different scholarship programs and assists over 2,500 students each year; more than \$3.64 million is awarded annually. The Most Valuable Student offers annual awards of more than \$2.96 million in college scholarships to 500 high school seniors nationwide. Any U.S. citizen is eligible to apply. Top awards range from \$8,000 to \$60,000 over four years. There is a \$4,000 scholarship awarded to an additional 484 high school students.

Legacy Awards are given to children and grandchildren, step children, or legal awards of Elks as long as they are in good standings. These awards are four-year, \$4,000 merit-based scholarships.

ENF also has an Emergency Educational Grant for one year that is offered to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks. The amount of the grant can range up to \$4,000 yearly.

Our lodge has dropped of application forms for the Most Valuable Student award to the Manatee School of the Arts and Palmetto High School for this years graduate students.

If you as an Elk have a child, grandchild, step-child, or have a legal ward and interested in the Legacy Scholarship, or know of a family that can benefit from the Emergency Educational Grant, contact the lodge or Wes Townsend for information.
