Some interesting November history and facts to remember.

November 1, 1941 – President Franklin D. Roosevelt's Executive Order 8929 transferred the Coast Guard to Navy Department control.

November 2, 1976 – Former Georgia Gov. (James Earl) Jimmy Carter defeated Republican incumbent Gerald R. Ford

November 3, 1936 – President Roosevelt, the 32nd president, was reelected for second term in a landslide over Republican challenger Alfred M. "Alf" Landon.

November 3, 1941 – The Combined Japanese Fleet receive Top-Secret Order No. 1: In 34 days time, Pearl Harbor is to be bombed, along with Mayala, the Dutch East Indies, and the Philippines

November 4, 1980 – Ronald Reagan was elected the 40th president of the United States. He beat President Carter by a wide margin

November 5, 1996 – Pres. William Jefferson Clinton was re-elected in the US but voters kept Congress in Republican control.

November 7, 1957 – The final report from a special committee called by President Dwight D. Eisenhower to review the nation's defense readiness indicates that the United States is falling far behind the Soviets in missile capabilities, and urges a vigorous campaign to build fallout shelters to protect American citizens.

November 8, 1945 – In the wake of World War II, America needed to convert its economy back to peacetime conditions. The passage of the Revenue Act of 1945 on November 8 was a key step in rolling back the heavy taxes which had been implemented to help wage the war. Along with cutting \$6 billion in taxes, the Revenue Act initiated an extensive post-war revision of the nation's entire tax system.

November 9, 1967 – NASA (Nat

ional Aeronautics and Space Administration) launched Apollo 4 into orbit from Cape Kennedy with the first successful test of a Saturn V rocket. The Saturn V was the largest operational launch vehicle ever produced.

November 9, 1989 – East German officials today opened the Berlin Wall, allowing travel from East to West Berlin. The following day, celebrating Germans began to tear the wall down.

November 11, 1978 – Veteran's Day, originally know as Armistice Day, became a national holiday in 1938. It was changed back by Congress in this year to this day rather than the 4th Monday of October, which had been set in 1968.

November 12, 1948 – An international war crimes tribunal in Tokyo passes death sentences on seven Japanese military and government officials, including General Hideki Tojo, who served as premier of Japan from 1941 to 1944.

Veterans' Day History



Veteran's Day seeks to honor and give thanks to all the men and women who have served and are serving in the US Armed Forces. At 11:00 a.m. EST, the Veterans Day National Ceremony is held at Arlington

National Cemetery. At this ceremony the President of the United States, or his assigned ambassador, lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Veteran's Day is observed on November 11th each year. Please join the Elks at Bay Pines Hospital for the picnic in November.

November 13, 1982- Near the end of a weeklong national salute to Americans who served in the Vietnam War, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial is dedicated in Washington after a march to its site by thousands of veterans of the conflict.

November 15, 1979 – A package bomb aboard a commercial flight from Chicago exploded and forced an emergency landing at Dulles Airport. It was later attributed to the Unabomber Theodore Kaczynski.

November 16, 1907 - Indian Territory and Oklahoma Territory collectively enter the United States as Oklahoma, the 46th state.

November 16, 1945 – Eighty-eight German scientists, holding Nazi secrets, arrived in the U.S. In a move that stirs up some controversy, the United States ships 88 German scientists to America to assist the nation in its production of rocket technology.

November 19, 1863 – President Abraham Lincoln delivers one of the most famous speeches in American history at the dedication of the military cemetery at Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. "Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth, upon this continent, a new nation, conceived in Liberty......"

November 21, 1945 – When World War II finally ended, business and labor resumed their own struggle over power, profits and better working conditions. The first blow in the renewed battle was struck on this day in 1945, as the United Auto Workers staged the first postwar strike at the General Motors plant in Detroit, Michigan.

November 22, 1963- President John F. Kennedy is assassinated during a visit to Dallas,

November 22, 1988 – In the presence of members of Congress and the media, the Northrop B-2 "stealth" bomber is shown publicly for the first time at Air Force Plant 42 in Palmdale, California. November 25, 1867 – Alfred Nobel patented dynamite.

November 25, 1963 – Three days after his assassination in Dallas, Texas, John F. Kennedy is laid to rest with full military honors at Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia.

November 26, 1941 – President Franklin D. Roosevelt signs a bill officially establishing the fourth Thursday in November as Thanksgiving Day.

November 26, 1950 – In some of the fiercest fighting of the Korean War, thousands of communist Chinese troops launch massive counterattacks against U.S. and Republic of Korea (ROK) troops, driving the Allied forces before them and putting an end to any thoughts for a quick or conclusive U.S. victory.

November 27, 1944 – The second B-29 Superfortress bombing raid on Tokyo nominally targets the Musashi aircraft engine plant.

November 28, 1942 – The first production Ford bomber, the B-24 Liberator, rolled off the assembly line at Ford's massive Willow Run plant in Ypsilanti, Michigan.

November 29, 1952 – Making good on his most dramatic presidential campaign promise, newly elected Dwight D. Eisenhower goes to Korea to see whether he can find the key to ending the bitter and frustrating Korean War. The Chinese, exhausted by more than two years of war, finally agreed to terms and an armistice was signed on July 27, 1953.

We are requesting your help in getting Congress to pass Re: H.R 2794 Perpetual POW/MIA Stamp Act. Representative Gus Bilirakis of Florida's 12th congressional district is the bill's sponsor. If enacted the bill would provide for the issuance of a forever postage stamp to honor the sacrifices of the brave men and women of the Armed Forces who are still prisoner, missing, or unaccounted for, and for other purposes.

Terry Haberle and Jim Lamb have been working on this project since January 2014 when we had our Army of Hope fundraiser. Bill Allen, a Korean prisoner of war for over 2 ½ years was our guest speaker. He told us about this bill and the fact that it was going nowhere in the House of Representatives. During the fundraiser Bill posed the following question, "If the Beatles can have a postage stamp honoring them why can't we have one for our brothers that are missing in action."

This hit a few of us very hard. Soon after that event, Terry started researching H.R.2794 and this is what she found:

Status: The bill was assigned to a congressional committee on July 23, 2013, which will consider it before possibly sending it on to the House or Senate as a whole.

Prognosis: 18% chance of getting past the committee and only a 4% chance of being enacted. Only 11% of bills make it past committee and only about 3% were enacted in 2011–2013. A sample petition that can be used by your Lodge to help galvanize member interest and support for this bill. Lodges can send their signed petitions to me at the address shown below.

At this point we have received approximately 10,000 signatures on a petition, but we still need your support if this bill is to become a reality. It is very probable that only public pressure will bring H.R. 2794 to the floor for a vote. As Elks we need to show that WE DO CARE and are committed to our military personnel.




was, and continues to be, the collection of donations, the selling of trust fund certificates, and the acceptance of endowed gifts.
