### **Service Flag Designer Was an Elk**

Few people know that Robert L. Queisser, the inventor or the service flag, was a member of the BPOE Elks. Born in Indianapolis, Indiana, on August 9, 1866. Queisser joined the Elks as a member of the Springfield, Ohio Lodge sometime between 1886 and 1891and served as Exalted Ruler in 1891. In 1902 after spending a number of years working for the Baltimore and Ohio railroad, Queisser moved to Zanesville Ohio, where he joined the Zanesville Lodge and become general manager and assistant treasure of a brick making company. As a member of the Zanesville Lodge he went on to become Grand Esteemed Leading Knight in 1906-1907. Then in 1907 he moved to Cleveland Ohio, where he became a prominent businessman and served with the Fifth Regiment Ohio Infantry of the Ohio National Guard during the Mexican Expedition of 1916-1917. Although he did not serve in World War 1 because of an injury he received in an accident, his two sons, Charles and Robert Jr., did serve, and it was their service that inspired him to create the service flag.

"The thought came to me," he once wrote of the service flag's origins, "that both of my sons who were still officers in the Guard would again be called out, and I wondered if I could not evolve some design or symbol by which would be to their mother a visible sign of the sacrifice her sons were making." On November 6, 1917, seven months after the United States declared war on Germany, Queisser, patented his design for the service flag.

Although it was not authorized by the US Government at the time, soon after it's creation, the service flag's blue stars became widely recognized symbols indicating that the bearer of the flag had love ones, or in the case of organizations, members serving in the US armed forces. Because many of these individuals were men, the flag was sometimes known as the son-in-law service flag.
