Please don't forget that we are now open seven days a week. We also have the football package. So, on Saturday College games are on and on Sunday we are showing all the games you can not see at home.


If you are planning on coming in to watch the game, let me know and we will plan to have hamburgers or chicken sandwiches for \$5.00.

On December 7, 1941 The **attack on Pearl Harbor** was a surprise <u>military strike</u> conducted by the <u>Imperial Japanese Navy</u> against the <u>United States naval base</u> at <u>Pearl Harbor</u>, <u>Hawaii</u>. The attack led to the United States' entry into <u>World War II</u>. The lack of any formal warning, particularly while negotiations were still apparently ongoing, led President <u>Franklin D. Roosevelt</u> to proclaim December 7, 1941, "infamy". The attack on Pearl Harbor was intended to neutralize the U.S. Pacific Fleet, and hence protect Japan's advance into <u>Malaya</u> and the <u>Dutch East Indies</u>, where it sought access to <u>natural resources</u> such as <u>oil</u> and rubber

Today, the <u>USS Arizona Memorial</u> on the island of Oahu honors the lives lost on the day of the attack. Visitors to the memorial reach it via boats from the naval base at Pearl Harbor. Alfred Preis is the architect responsible for the memorial's design. The structure has a sagging center and its ends strong and vigorous. It commemorates "initial defeat and ultimate victory" of all lives lost on December 7, 1941. [116] Although December 7 is known as Pearl Harbor Day, it is not considered a federal holiday in the United States. The nation does however, continue to pay homage remembering the thousands injured and killed when attacked by the Japanese in 1941. Schools and other establishments in some places around the country lower the American flag to half-staff out of respect. [117]


